

As the holy word says, "The Lord will make you go through hard times, but he himself will be there to teach you, and you will not have to search for him anymore" (Is. 30:20)



IYCS ASIA CLIMATE SUMMIT AND EXTRAORDINARY COUNCIL

Assumption Church, Antipolo City, Phillipines. March 13-19, 2017.

The IYCS ASIA CLIMATE SUMMIT AND EXTRAORDINARY COUNCIL was held at Assumption Church, Antipolo City, Philippines from 13-14 March 2017. Seven Countries of Asia participated in the program. The program begins with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on Day 1 where IYCS ASIA Chaplain, Fr. Serge Maniba was the main celebrant together with Fr. Chetan Machado, National Chaplain of YCS/YSM India as the concelebrant. In the homily Fr. Serge Blessed all the participants and encouraged them to utilise the time given to them and reflect together for the future of IYCS Asia. After the Mass, Richard, General Secretary IYCS conducted the welcoming sessions where all participants joyfully interacted and get to know each other through various activities. Participants at the end of this session shared their happiness and viewed that though we came from different countries, as YCS, we still have a lot of similarities and this connection makes us more united

Richard then continued with the introduction to the session and sharing session. In this session questions were asked to all like who are we? What do we do? Where are we? All the participants were convinced with the answer that WE ARE YCS. We are students working to make the world better through self transformation and life improvement using the SEE-JUDGE-ACT and change others through our actions. Richard further touched about the importance of Review Of Life and

how YCS members need to live with it as their way of life.

As we entered SEE part, In the afternoon all National Movements presented the current situations of the environment in their own respective countries as an overlook at the Asian Situation. At the outset we are living in an environment rise with water pollution, air pollution. Land pollution, industrial pollution and an increasing alarm of Global warming and climate change. All these put a danger to the earth that we are living today and to humanity in particular. With some of these identifications we feel that we must do something to protect mother earth so as to protect ourselves.

In the exposure part all delegates visited the Ecological Friendly School and witnessed the beauty of God's Creation in the form of

varieties of blooming flowers, humble little insects, colourful butterflies, birds, animals and the fresh air supplied to us by the wonderful living trees inside the small park maintained by school students with the help of school authorities.

As days moved on we entered into Judge Part. In this, Br Christopher Garit from the Marist Congregation spent his time with delegates



to reflect on the protection of our Common Home and particularly about the personal and missiological reflection on the "*Laudato Si*". He emphasized that *Laudato Si* is a call for all people of good will to give praise to God by healing the wounded creation (mother earth). People are not the masters of creation and God does not give us the power of dominion over the earth but the power to take care the earth and protect it. Hence it is our responsibility to restore balance in our common home.

Workshop on other aspect of IYCS Global Campaign was conducted and case study was given to each delegate to reflect. Delegates were asked to put themselves into the situation as per the scenario they are getting and expressed without speaking who they are. Delegates were then divided into groups and each group discussed each topic and topics were environment, education, peace and conflict and to suggest concrete solutions.

Several exercises were conducted to make the delegates go deep into the reflection part such as Climate Negotiation games- reflection on

the current political and economical scenario of countries on the reduction of global warming. International climate courts where delegates were divided into two parties, old and new generation and both parties presented their case against each other on the effects of climate change, the court then ordered both the parties to prepare various action plans to restore back the environment.

Coming to the Action part, delegates were asked to sit with in their own sub-regions and prepare action plans for tackling climate change and preservation of the environment. After reflecting and gathering on the needs and concerns to take actions against ecological crisis all sub regions decided to love and respect God's creation and to encourage students through Review Of Life to take educational initiatives and to integrate environmental practices in all YCS activities, to promote value-based education utilizing social media, to incorporate environmental concerns into various YCS trainings and to implement tree plantation projects and environmental advocacy in all aspects of YCS life and missions.



An exposure visit was also organised and delegates visited the Avocado Residence the house co-owned by IYCS and IMCS and the IYCS office situated near the residence.

The historic extraordinary council of IYCS Asia was held on Day 5 where certain legal

matters and finances were discussed apart from the discussions on the future of YCS Asian Coordination and IYCS Properties situated in Manila. After a long session, on the consensus of decisions the council formed an Interim Coordination Team for the year 2017-



2018 until the IYCS Asian Council. The team composed of Mr. Stevenson (Philippines), Mr. Jimmy (India), John and Jessica (Taiwan), Fr. Serge (IYCS Asia Chaplain). With the guidance of an Advisory Board composed of Fr. Serge Maniba, Former members (Teresa Mourad, Manoj Mathew, Ha Ngo) and Cyril Lituanas (SCAP). Miss Althea has been identified to be the Secretary and voted by all National Movements.

Regarding about the two properties, all delegates witnesses the bad conditions of both the house and office and National Movements are of the view that Philippines are not familiar to them so the decisions either to sell and buy new property or to renovate would be difficult for them to decide. The Council created a committee consisting of Fr. Serge, Fr. Aloysius (Malaysia), Loucille (PHL) and Althea (PHL) to do the research and assessment within three months and the committee then will send a proposal to all the National Movements to present the big picture and an online voting will then take place since the council has decided to adopt Rule 5A of IYCS Statutes. The Council has a consensus for the adoption of the solidarity fee and the amount would be \$50. In relation with legal matters and finances a Board has been constituted for SEC registration and bank signatories for IYCS-ASIA Account are Fr. Serge Maniba (Chaplain) and Frence Boiser (National Coordinator of SCAP). The council ended with the adoption of the Final Statement.

Not to forget that everyday delegates gathered together in the garden every morning for the morning prayer and evening for the holy mass and each day sessions were concluded with a social evenings and entertainment from all sub-regions. The program was further enlightened with special dinners with former members and invited guests.

The IYCSAsia Climate Summit/extraordinary Asian Council Meeting was concluded with a thanksgiving Mass on the beautiful morning of the last day and immediately after Breakfast, delegates departed with joyful heart and tons of experiences.

Revitalize the YOUTH MINISTRY



have spent the last 29 years of my priestly life, mainly with the youth ministry. As the first Regional Youth Director of MP, I have given my contribution to stabilize the youth commission in MP and Chattisgarh by establishing a Regional Youth Center (in Vidisha, which was later shifted to Khandwa) and spreading the ministry

by persuading bishops to appoint a director for the youth ministry. During that time, we had launched the youth magazine Vikalp. From its humble beginnings as a quarterly, it grew into a monthly magazine with 5000 subscribers. Today, it has again become a quarterly newsletter of the youth commission, runs with subsidy from dioceses. I was also one of those who was very actively involved in the formation of the National Youth Commission with Archbishop Abraham as its chairman. After leaving the official responsibility as Regional Youth Director, I did not give up my youth ministry. I continued my animation work for youth, both in the rural and urban


areas. The present work which I do through USM is only an expansion and fullness of the work which I had been doing among Catholic youth. Through this movement,

we influence and train thousands of young people of all faiths and cultures.

When I heard about the CBCI meeting in Guwahati, Assam, in February 2010 where the bishops would be discussing the youth







ministry, I thought of placing some of my concerns about the youth ministry and my proposals to make more vibrant to bear lasting fruit. I wrote these reflections to the chairman of the youth commission after my third visit to the Kandhamal mission in Odisha to study the impact of communal violence.

In face, I wanted to write some of my concerns and observations about the youth conventions which are held regularly at the national level. One such national convention was held in Cuttack in Odisha a few months before the Christians were attacked in Kandhamal region. Though mega event was conducted in Cuttack, with more than a thousand youth, there were many complaints about its organization, the behavior of the priests and young people aired by local persons

associated with the event. After every youth convention at least some genuine young people feel disillusioned by the way it was organized.

In the fast changing socio-political context, the only

ministry which will bear fruit is from our work with youth. When I say youth, I also mean the thousands of young students who are in our colleges and schools. The following suggestions may be useful:

1. Have clarity of vision, goals and policies for the youth ministry. The vision should be based on our deep experiences about the power of youth force, the possibilities of using their maximum energy and talents for giving leadership in society. It is important to be aware of the negative forces which affect youth in society and the an ability of our youth animators and directors to meet these challenges.

2. We need to be clear about what we expect our youth to be. Just making them docile, pious boys and girls will not work. Youth may stay with us for some time to



sing in the liturgy and other celebrations. Have we done an evaluation of what the youth does after they get opportunities and benefits from us? How many students from our educational institutions have given outstanding contribution to society and recognized their contribution by the whole society? What has happened to the number of youth who attended our national and international meetings? What are their contributions to the Church and to the larger society? Despite special privileges and concessions given to our Catholic youth how much do they influence society in their work place and give leadership? Let us not be complacent because of their presence in the Church functions. The question is how are they giving leadership in society and influencing it?

3. Thousands of youth were brought to Odisha during the last youth convention. Did any of the youth directors or national youth commission ever think of getting some of our youth from different parts of the country to go to Khandhamal both

for exposure and serve as volunteers in the relief camps and the reconstruction of the villages as non Christian students do while they are in the colleges as part of the NSS program? Since they had been to Odisha for a mega event they could have been organized to do this service actively in small groups. This can be done even now, since many houses of the villagers have not been rebuilt? Why don't the bishops who gather in Assam give a call for such a creative venture? The national vouth commission can organize this great work in collaboration with the local bishop and priests. Youth would be happy to collaborate with this adventurous work. They need to be motivated with genuine spirituality.

4. It is good to introspect the impact of Anti-church attacks on youth? How much do they know about it? In what way have our youth directors and commissions given them awareness to it?

5. It is important to evaluate the impacts of the various youth events at the parish, diocesan, regional and national levels with a larger vision frame, i.e. their responsibility and commitment to the Church and to the nation by these youth leaders.

The YCS/YSM 6. has a powerful vision and spirituality. My own priesthood has been enriched by the vision and spirituality of YCS/ YSM. Unfortunately, our animators themselves are not aware of its spirituality. To which I hardly find this powerful movement active an any of our schools where we go. The youth movement in most of the places (as I travel widely all over India) is reduced to holding a yearly convention and meetings abroad. Spiritual growth of the youth and formation of vision of life are missing in its dynamics. Gathering them for a Holy Mass with special singing and rosary procession once a month


is not youth ministry.

7. The selection of youth animators is also an important thing. Being a young priest is not the criterion by which one should be appointed youth director. The director and animators should be mature both in age and wisdom to guide and train youth to face the difficult world. The stability of their job is also important. This job is not to be a part time or short time affair. It should be a full time job with permanency. The directors and animators need serious training and exposure before they take up the job. (continued)



Our nature is to search for answers to life's questions, concepts we don't understand, like "What is perfection?"




EXPERIENCING THE THRILL OF LIFE


I was selected as a NEXCO member for 2013-2016 and I got a 'fantabulous'



YCS UDUPI - YCS ANIMATORS EVALUATION & TRAINING


